Special Needs Volunteerism & Training

Parent of Nathaniel Vincent Smith -Ongoing, Daily Training

December 3, 2009 - Present

Our son, Nate, was born with three interstitial deletions on one of his Chromosome 1 copies. He was diagnosed at birth because of some dismorphic facial features. His deletions have caused several health and developmental related issues that we have been dealing with in varying degrees over the past 12 years. They are the following in order of how much they affect him:

- Hypoplasia of the Corpus Callosum HCC is a brain malformation of the bundle of 190 million nerve fibers that join the left and right hemispheres of the brain. The Corpus Callosum is responsible for coordination of gross, fine and oral motor movements. It also aids the brain in interpreting what is going on around your body spatially, social interactions and helps with self-regulation. It acts as a bridge across the hemispheres. If the bridge is smaller, as in Nate's case, traffic gets a little backed up. People with callosal disorders tend to have normal intelligence, but slow processing speeds and social awkwardness. Incidence is estimated to be 1:4000.
- ADHD Inattentive
- Mild-Moderate Hearing Loss Indentified by EDHI newborn infant hearing screening at birth
- Facial Paresis Mostly in the lower face, similar to Stickler or Moebius Syndromes
- Nystagmus and various vision problems that have resolved (Strabismus, Macular Hypoplasia, Tear Ducts)
- Epileptic activity during sleep and wakefulness similar to a person who has been diagnosed with epilepsy.

Governor's Council on Hereditary and Congenital Disorders – Voting Member 2016 - Present

The primary task of the State Advisory council on Hereditary and Congenital Disorders is to educate itself and advise the State about disorders that could be added to the Newborn Screening tests provided by the State of Maryland.

- Review new diagnosis methods and treatments for congenital and hereditary disorders in order to make recommendations to the State for inclusion into the Newborn Screening process.
- Continually reevaluate the State's diagnosis methods for disorders already within Maryland's newborn Screening program for effectiveness and to align with best practices around the United States.
- Educate the public and stakeholders to further their understanding of these rare conditions and how they are diagnosed and treated.

Families as Faculty Educator

Parents Place of Maryland facilitates the Families as Faculty Program training experience that offers pediatric residents, medical students, public health students and other related allied professional trainees an opportunity to learn from families. In the comfort and relaxed atmosphere of their homes, families can tell their story, talk candidly about the special challenges they face and reflect openly and honestly on their experiences with health care professionals.

- Parents discuss with groups of 2-3 students every 1-2 months how living with a Special Needs child affects daily
 life and relationships with the medical community and support services.
- Share experiences and our medical story to offer perspective to these future care providers.
- 5 Core Values and Skills are promoted to students: Good Communication, Building Collaborative Relationships, Identify and Promote Family Strengths, Respecting Beliefs regarding Health and well-being and lastly, Showing Compassion.
